School Day

It has been great to see the children excitedly running through our gates in the morning. A gentle reminder of our school day:

The gates open at 8.30am, all children should make their way to the main playground. The bell will ring at 8.45am indicating for children to line up with their classes where they will be collected by their teaching team.

Any parent/carer on the playground after 8.50am will need to leave by the main gate as the side gates will be locked promptly.

Late Arrivals

The start of the day is really important for your child's learning and sets them up for the rest of the days learning. Learning starts as soon as they arrive. Any child arriving after the gates have closed, will unfortunately have to be marked as late on the register. This has an impact on their overall attendance and persistent lateness will result in missing important learning.

Attendance

96% attendance below this has an impact on your child's learning. Where attendance is at risk of going below this level we will let you know by letter. We are here to support you and your children so please speak to your child's class teacher if there are any concerns.

During Friday's assembly there is an opportunity for your child's class to win prizes if their class has the best overall attendance for that week! This could be extra time on the farm or even spending time caring for our resident guinea pigs!

If your child is not attending school due to illness, please contact the office before 9.30am. This can be by phone, voicemail message or email to advise the reason for their absence.

Term Time Holiday Requests

Absence during term time has an impact on children's learning, there are 175 days, during which you can take your children on holiday for days out. Absence requests will only be granted in exceptional circumstances by our Governing Team.

We would like to remind parents that a fine is enforceable for removing your child from school without a valid reason.

Free School Meals

Children in Reception, Year 1 & 2 all receive Universal free school meals until they move into Year 3, then parents would need to start adding money to their child's account for school lunches. If you are in receipt of certain benefits you may be eligible for free school meals through the local authority, you should apply for these once your child starts in Reception or when your circumstances change. If you meet their criteria, we will then be able to assist you with support in other elements of school life i.e. uniform and trips assistance. School Uniform

Children are required to wear full black shoes; black or grey knee length skirt; black or grey trousers/shorts; white polo shirt or white shirt along with red school sweatshirt or cardigan/plain red sweatshirt or cardigan.

A change of clothes for physical activities is essential. Items required are:

Shorts (not shiny material) – black or white White vest/t- shirt or leotards

KS2 learners will also need outdoor kits all year round (KS1/R summer term only)

For swimming your child will need a swimming costume and large towel. We provide all swimming aids.
