Bradgate Park, Leicester, England

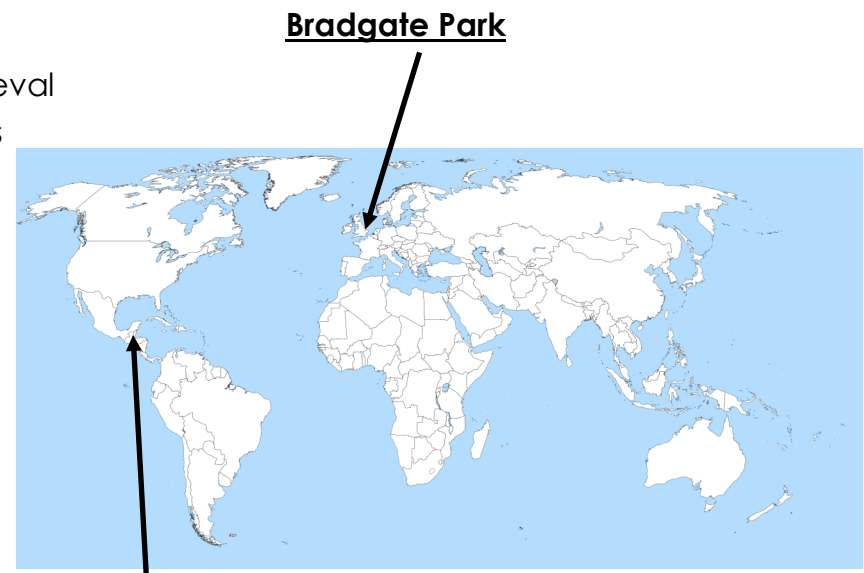

Chichén Itzá, Yucatan Peninsula, Mexico

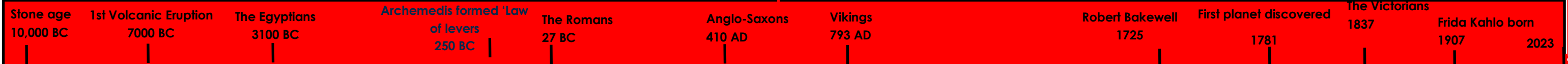
Mexico

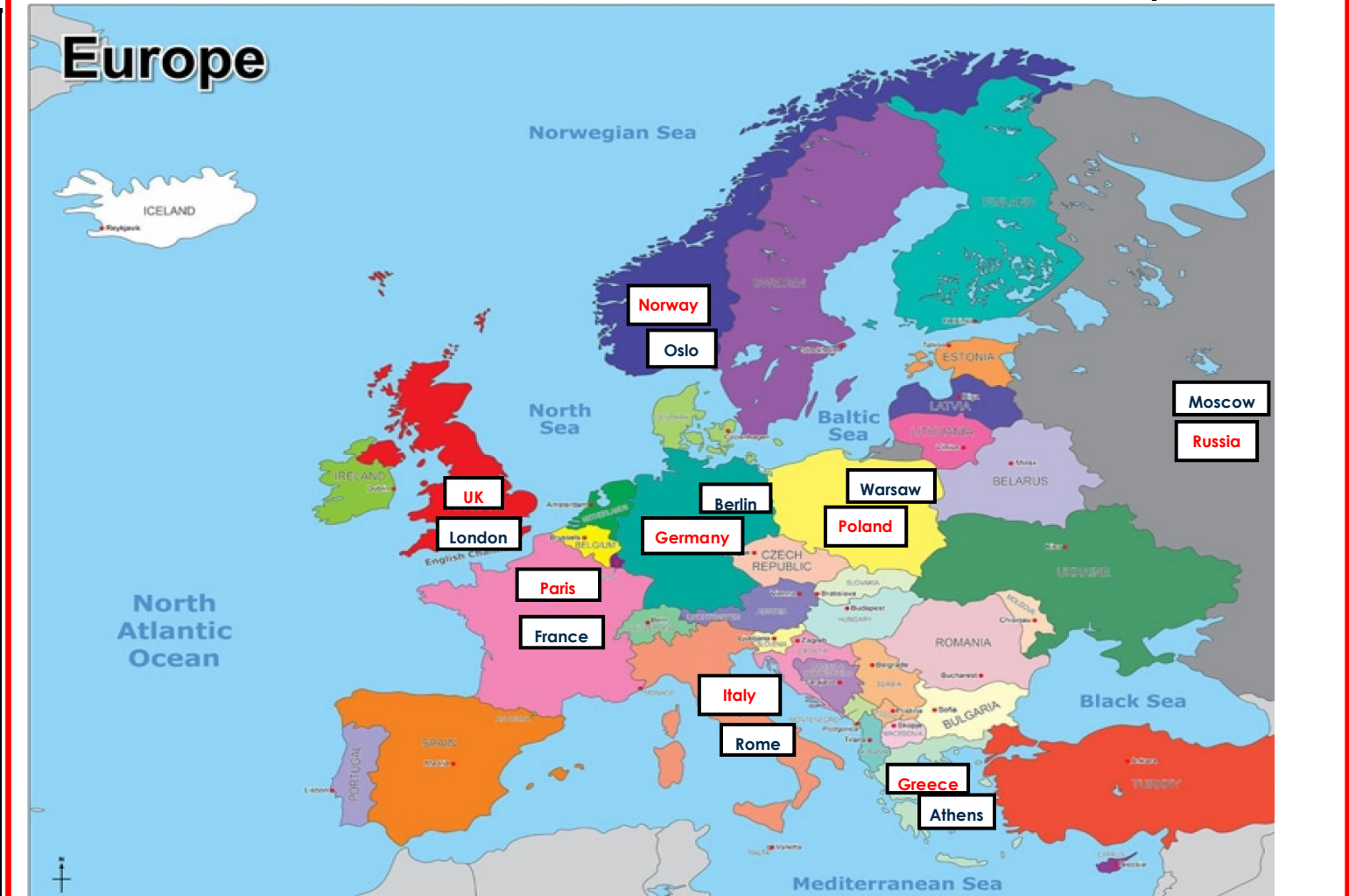
The ocean is the body of salt water that covers approximately 70.8% of the Earth and contains 97% of Earth's water.
