

Key Vocabulary and Definition

deforestation	The clearing of forest to make way for farming or to use the wood for fuel,
ecosystem	A community of interacting organisms and their physical environment.
equator	An imaginary line, halfway between the north and south poles, that divides the Earth into the northern and southern hemispheres.
landfill	The oldest and most common form of waste disposal. A dumping ground for the disposal of waste materials
Magnet	A material or object that produces an invisible magnetic field. It pulls on other magnetic materials and attracts or repels other magnets.
rainforest	A closed and continuous tree canopy with moisture dependent vegetation
recycle	Recycling turns waste (rubbish) into reusable material
resource	A useful or valuable possession. These can be natural or man-made
