
How Switched on Were The Victorians?

Queen Victoria

- Queen Victoria was the Queen of England between 1837 and 1901. The Victorian period is named after her!
- She was born at Kensington Palace, London, in 1819.
- Queen Victoria became the Queen when she was only 18 years old.
- During her reign, the British Empire included Australia, South Africa, India, New Zealand and Canada.
- Queen Victoria died in 1901
 - The Victoria Sponge was named after Queen Victoria, who regularly ate a slice of sponge cake with her tea, each afternoon!



Industrial revolution

- The Industrial Revolution is the name for a time of great change in industry, technology and science
- The Industrial Revolution began around 1760.
- In 1830, the first public railway between Liverpool and Manchester opened
- By 1870, there were 100 000 steam engines at work in Britain
- Coal was used to heat water to make steam for the steam engine
